# Dublin Airport Update

03 February 2026

No	Issue	daa response
1.	<b>LOG</b> requested further information the ECJ review.	Response issued via email 12 December 2025.
2.	<b>JS</b> questioned how the runoff water from aprons and runways is managed and stored at Dublin Airport given the recent extreme weather conditions, what mitigations are in place, and how the water is monitored.	<p>Dublin Airport holds a Trade Effluent Discharge Licence (TEDL) with Uisce Éireann to manage polluted surface water run-off due to airport activities such as aircraft de-icing. Three pollution control systems manage polluted run-off from the South Apron, North Apron and North Runway and polluted water holding tanks serving these locations have a combined storage capacity of 25,300 m<sup>3</sup>. Receiving streams are monitored continuously by TOC (total organic carbon) analysers. On detection of pollution levels water is diverted to the pollution water holding tanks and subsequently pumped to foul sewer. Dublin Airport monitors pollution levels in water diverted to foul sewer and regularly reports to Uisce Éireann on monitoring results in accordance with Dublin Airport's licence requirements.</p> <p>Dublin Airport also routinely completes surface water monitoring of all streams on the Dublin Airport campus. Surface water monitoring results are reported quarterly to community representatives at the Dulin Airport Environment Working Group (DAEWG).</p>
3.	<b>JD</b> advised that meetings dates for 2026 would be circulated to all members for consideration with initial first meeting scheduled to take place at the end of January.	Dates issued: 24 March, 12 May, 21 July, 8 September, and 3 November.
